Blackwood Farmers Market group hopes to revitalize downtown

A group of dedicated Blackwood citizens is hoping to sprout some spirit in the downtown area by way of a few fruits and veggies.

Two years ago, a group of residents attending a Neighborhood Preservation Program meeting began discussing the need to "bring life back into the center of Blackwood," said Isabelle Miller, one of the market's managers.

A fellow resident suggested opening a market, and the Blackwood Farmers Market soon became a reality.

This year, the market is open every Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. until Oct. 9.

A dozen Blackwood residents work each week to bring fresh fruits, vegetables and other tasty items — honey, jam, salsa and baked goods — to the community.

"Each member takes a turn being the market manager, but most of us are down there every week," said Miller. "It's a great way to meet neighbors and make new friends. It's a really fun day."

Items on sale at the market come from local merchants, she said.

"We have a nice variety," said Miller, "It's

about 10 to 12 great vendors, who are very friendly, who come just about every week."

Handcrafted items, such as candles and jewelry, are also available, according to the manager.

"We even have one guy who makes his own dog biscuits," she said.

Yard sale space is available the last Saturday of each month, Miller added.

The market has seen several hundred visi-



tors throughout the course of the summer, according to its managers.

"We're really pleased with the turnout," said Miller. "The farmers seem pleased, too; a lot of them have their stands empty at the end of the day."

The market is an extension of a community rejuvenation effort that also organizes Pumpkin Fest in October and a Christmas parade.

"We want to revitalize it and build it up — like Collingswood," said Miller. "Our objective is to draw people back into the town and show them that it's a vital community."

The farmers market, open rain or shine, is located at 15 S. Blackhorse Pike.

FRUIT STRIPED POPS

2 cups strawberries

3/4 cup honey, divided

6 kiwifruit, peeled and sliced

2 cups peaches peeled and sliced

12 paper cups (3oz. size) or popsicle molds

12 popsicle sticks

In blender or food processor, puree strawberries with 1/4 cup honey. Divide mixture evenly between 12 cups or molds. Freeze until firm, about 30 minutes. Meanwhile, rinse blender; puree kiwifruit with 1/4 cup honey. Repeat process with peaches and remaining 1/4 cup honey. When strawberry layer is firm, pour kiwifruit puree into molds. Insert a popsicle stick and freeze until firm, about 30 minutes. Pour peach puree into molds and freeze until firm and ready to serve.
