Description of the standards that relate to those listed in section II of the "What to Do" section:

A. Woodbridge Waterfront Park: Formerly known as Nuodex corporation Facility and is approximately 3 acres of tidal wetlands, 44 acres of emergent freshwater wetlands (marsh, pond, forest, and scrub-shrub habitat types), 31 acres of upland habitat (maritime forest, maritime meadow, maritime shrub, salt shrubland, and existing forest habitat types), and described in the attached as Exhibit "A" hereto.
