

HABITAT CONSERVATION ORDINANCE – WOODBRIDGE TWP. – upload 2

Description of the standards that relate to those listed in section II of the “What to Do” section:

A. Woodbridge Waterfront Park: Formerly known as Nuodex corporation Facility and is approximately 3 acres of tidal wetlands, 44 acres of emergent freshwater wetlands (marsh, pond, forest, and scrub-shrub habitat types), 31 acres of upland habitat (maritime forest, maritime meadow, maritime shrub, salt shrubland, and existing forest habitat types), and described in the attached as Exhibit “A” hereto.

C. Conservation Easements on Former Nuodex Corporation:
