TAKE THE CHALLENGE

The GrEEn Day Challenge is a contest to design the official logo for the 2009 What: GrEEn Day Fair. GrEEn Day is an annual event designed to raise awareness about environmental responsibility in our community. This year will be the first time five Central New Jersey towns (Warren, Watchung, Green Brook, Long Hill Township and North Plainfield) will be coming together to celebrate the event.

Grand prize winner will have their design displayed on all advertising and event-Why: related materials including bags, t-shirts, posters, and advertisements. Winner will also be featured in the Warren Showcase magazine.

Deadline for submissions is June 08, 2009. GrEEn Day Fair is October 17, 2009. When:

Who: Contest applicants must be of high school age and either currently enrolled in one of the five towns' (Warren, Watchung, Green Brook, North Plainfield, Long Hill Township) public or private high schools or are being home schooled.

Details: The Green Day logo design should reflect this year's event theme, Caring and Connecting Our Communities, One Footprint at a Time. The design should also communicate the community's vision to raise environmental and energy conservation awareness, as well as educate about the event's goals of conservation, sustainability and recycling. Ideally, art work should be formatted for submission in 300 dpi Adobe Illustrator EPS, PDF file or an Adobe Photoshop, TIFF, PDF file.

> All submissions must include student contact information, school name and town, age and grade level. All art work must be sent electronically (via e-mail or disc) by June 08, 2009 to the event director, Sue Jain at sugram a great com. If desired, a CD and/or one hard copy print of the electronic file, in sizes no larger than 8x12, can be mailed care of GrEEn Day Fair, P.O. Box 4174, Warren, N.J. 07059.

Judging: Submissions will be judged by the GrEEn Day Joint Commission and special guests from community organizations. The winning design will be judged on overall design concept and adherence to the theme and mission of the event. The winner will be selected and notified by June 15, 2009.

Central Jersey Towns Gear-Up for First Regional Community Event Green Day Challenge Logo Design Contest Warren High School Senior Wins

July 07, 2009, Green Brook, NJ – The GrEEn Day 2009 Joint Committee announced today that Watchung Hills Regional High School senior and Warren resident, Alexa Nelson has been selected winner of the first GrEEn Day Challenge logo design contest. The contest is a high school art competition to develop the official logo for the GrEEn Day 2009 Environmental and Energy Conservation Fair. The event is scheduled for October 18, 2009, at the Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS).

As winner, Ms. Nelson will receive recognition for her work, which will be displayed on all advertising and event-related materials including bags, T-shirts, posters and advertisements. Additionally, she will receive an exclusive interview and \$100 gift certificate and will receive a solo art exhibit at the newly refurbished Watchung Art Center. Her work will be accompanied by the top ten entries from the contest.

"We are extremely proud of all the Graphic Design student efforts and feel that Alexa has created a logo that delivers the GrEEn Day organization message in an exciting way, while remaining whimsical and modern at the same time," said Steven Speeney, Arts Department Teacher, Watchung Hills Regional High School.

The GrEEn Day logo design was to reflect this year's event

theme, Caring and Connecting Our Communities, One Footprint at a Time. The design should communicate the community's vision to raise environmental and energy conservation awareness, as well as educate about the event's goals of conservation, sustainability and recycling.

According to Ms. Nelson, she loves creating art and has enrolled in several computer graphics courses during her time at WHRHS. She also designs posters for school plays and events, as well as clothing for the school's sports teams. Alexa will be a freshman at Penn State University this fall where she will be considering a major in communication disorders (speech pathology and audiology) and a minor in graphic design.

"Keeping with the contest theme, I envisioned a foot being the main feature of the logo. And because it's connected to being "green" and conserving the environment, I also imagined a green leaf as a prominent aspect. Therefore, I decided to combine both of the ideas to make a foot also look like a green leaf," said Ms. Nelson.


Officials from each of the four towns participating in the GrEEn Day Fair (Warren, Watchung, Green Brook, and Long Hill Township) worked with school district leaders to encourage student participation through art teachers and community awareness efforts.

Among the 33 artwork submissions, designs were evaluated into a "Top

Ten" group. The scores from all 10 judges for the Top Ten short listed entries were added for each category: creativity of design, relevance to theme, uniqueness, and appropriateness as a logo. An overall score was calculated by adding scores for all categories for the top ten entries.

About Green Day 2009: The one-day fun filled Green Day Fair is designed to raise awareness about environmental issues within our communities and the impact individuals can have through implementation of small changes in their day-to-day life. The Green Day 2009 Fair, scheduled to be held Sunday. October 18th, is expected to be the largest event of its kind to date, attracting scores of vendors, artists and performers all sharing the common goal of creating greater awareness about both local and global environmental issues.
